Course Outline

Welcome to Art 9! This course builds upon your previous experiences with techniques to develop a portfolio for your ideas and personal style. Throughout this semester we will make art, look at art and talk about art. Students will explore the Elements and Principles of design developing skills that are fundamental to drawing, painting and sculpture. Students will complete a portfolio of work that demonstrates artistic growth and experimentation with materials & processes. This course is primarily 2-dimensional with one 3-dimentional opportunity, as there is now a Ceramics course offered.

EXPECTATIONS/ CLEAN UP:

- Studio Etiquette & Netiquette (Respect each other in person and online, respect supplies, participate in art critiques and class discussions, clean up after yourself-Tools & Tables wiped and tidied.)
- Each table will do one week of clean up (sinks, paintbrushes, other materials)
